TTYSB's professional staff provided Clinical Services or Community-Based Diversion Programming (Juvenile Review Board) to teens from Chester, Deep River and Essex. We helped teens identify underlying problems + provided holistic tools to build resiliency, restore relationships + reach their personal goals at school & in life.

## What We Learned: 41% of local high school students...

...who identified the lowest number of **Developmental Assets** (10 or less...see backside for more info!) also reported that they skipped school once or more in the previous month. By partnering with Region 4 on this issue, **Tri-Town Youth Services'**will be able to help families connect students + caregivers to the support they need

to problem solve & make education a priority.



### DEVELOPMENTAL ASSETS: THE HEART OF OUR WORK

In 2005, Tri-Town Youth Services adopted The Search Institute's Developmental Assets Model, based upon the proven theory that helping youth experience healthy developmental resources & opportunities is one of the best ways to prevent negative behaviors + outcomes as they get older. The Developmental Assets are 40 research-based, positive experiences & qualities that influence young people's development, helping them become caring, responsible + productive adults. Promoting these Assets is at the heart of Tri-Town's work in our community.

Our agency and its related **Substance Abuse Prevention Coalition** work across sectors to build youth assets & address a range of behavioral health issues facing young people, while also addressing the needs of those who care for them.

We are working to inspire positive changes in the attitudes & practices of individuals, community organizations, businesses & town government through advocacy + by demonstrating that youth are valuable, integral members of our community with skills & ideas to share with all of us.

The work of the Substance Abuse Prevention Coalition in 2018 is a shining example of how Tri-Town has been able

to engage a diverse group of individuals to think creatively about how we can build more Developmental Assets & how we can reduce teen alcohol and drug use.

Entirely a grassroots effort, the Coalition is made of people who live, work and go to school in our community. Our members include TRI-TOWN YOUTH SERVICES

local government officials, park & recreation directors, business leaders, school administrators & staff, local police, clergy, health care professionals, high school students + parents.

They currently volunteer their time on four very active work groups: Parent Advisory Group, Youth Action Council, Community Wellness Committee & Policy Task Force.

Through youth surveys, community focus groups & other means of data collection, the Substance Abuse Prevention Coalition has unique insight into the behaviors + attitudes of local youth. As the Coalition works toward reducing teen alcohol & drug use, it is also able to provide valuable information about teens' internal + external Developmental Assets (including Family Support, Peer Influence, School Engagement, Decision-Making Ability & Self-Esteem).

The most recent youth survey revealed that only 30% of local teens feel valued by our community.

It is an important reminder that as successful as many of our initiatives are, there is still much more work to be done to engage young people, allow their voices to be heard & provide more opportunities for them to work alongside adults on local projects + initiatives.
